Principal's Report

Hello community!

We welcome a number of new staff to our team...

Sara Timms is our new Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader (part of the Mental Health in Primary Schools funding). Sara had worked at our school prior as a CRT and was very excited to get this role and will be with us on Mondays and Fridays. This is a new role that has the following functions:

Embed evidence-based training and resources across the school to build the capability of teaching and educational support staff to better identify and support students with mental health concerns

Support the school to create clear pathways for referrals for students identified as requiring further assessment and intervention within the school and connect with local community-based services

Proactively work with regional staff (i.e. Student Support Services), school wellbeing team, and other health professionals to engage appropriate mental health support as required

Support the school to implement effective mental health strategies aligned to social and emotional learning in the curriculum and whole-school approaches to health, wellbeing, teaching and learning

Contribute to larger scale reform development about what works to support primary school students' mental health

Adrianna Lourandos was appointed to a role of Therapy Support as we were unable to fill Yvette's Speech Pathologist position whilst she is on maternity leave. She began last week in this role, which is a short term position till the end of the year.

Whilst Tom is on leave this term, we have Nick Morgan-Lowe teaching on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays and Faith Swiftwolfe on Tuesdays and Fridays (the first four weeks of his leave) and Ellie Kavanagh for the remaining four weeks of term. We are very grateful for the work that they are doing.

Swimming has begun this term for a portion of the school cohort, with different year levels attending on different days. Reservoir Leisure Centre is very supportive of our students and these programs and the kids attending are loving their time in the water.

The extension of the Café program is working extremely well, particularly the student lunch orders on Tuesdays. This has also broadened the activities for our older students as well as increased the number of students who access this important program. Make sure that you are taking the opportunity to order lunch for your children as it is a great opportunity for them to try different foods as well as experience a 'canteen model' of service that many schools do not have.

Creative Learning Partnership Grant

Dear Coburg SDS Community,

It is my pleasure to announce that we have won a \$35,000 Creative Learning Partnership grant for Polyglot Theatre to work with us as artists in residence in Term 4. Celebrating its 40th anniversary last year, the grant program provides funding to Victorian schools to engage expert theatre makers, musicians, performers, animators and artists to work with students and teachers in a creative residency.

Polyglot Theatre is an international company that approached Warren in late 2019 asking if they could workshop their show for the inclusive arts festival, Alter State, called 'When the world turns'. Polyglot's director Sue and I wrote the Creative Learning Partnership grant application together.

The grant will provide us with 6 weeks of 3 artists working during our art classes, with the final 2 weeks including a production manager. We are planning to create an end of year 'concert' like no other! It may involve interactive spaces, audio visual material and sculpture. We plan to celebrate our time at Harmony Park coming to an end before we move to our new bigger school.

We are very excited to have this opportunity to work together to create something we are sure everyone will enjoy.

Smile Squad

General Information

The friendly Smile Squad dental team will provide Victorian public primary and secondary school students with a free, high quality annual dental health examination and free follow up treatment as needed.

What is included?

At the first appointment (the check-up), Smile Squad will check your child's teeth.

Then, depending on your child's needs, services may include:

- x-rays
- fluoride varnish
- scale and clean
- fissure sealants
- a free dental pack: a toothbrush, toothpaste and information
- advice about dental health and diet

If a child needs more treatment, like a filling, Smile Squad will contact parents/guardians and make a second appointment. These extra treatments are also **completely free**.

The program does not include cosmetic procedures.

What will Smile Squad do?

First, Smile Squad will visit your child's school to check your child's teeth and provide preventive care. This takes about 15 minutes.

If your child doesn't need any extra treatment, Smile Squad will see your child again in 12 months.

If your child needs extra treatment, Smile Squad will send home an individual care plan for you to read. Then, Smile Squad will call you to talk about what your child needs and ask for your consent to the extra treatment. Smile Squad will make a new appointment for your child for the treatment. Usually, this appointment will also be at the school. This treatment is also free.

Students will also receive a free dental pack and education on teeth brushing and healthy eating.

If you have a dental emergency or require oral health advice, please contact the Royal Dental Hospital Melbourne on <u>9341 1000</u> (outside Melbourne metro call: <u>1800 833 039</u>) or use the <u>online community dental clinics search</u> for a list of dental clinics in your area. You may also visit <u>www.dhsv.org.au</u> if you require any further information.

To keep your teeth strong and healthy, eat well, drink tap water, and brush twice a day with fluoride toothpaste.

Forms Available:

Is your child turning 16? Call Centrelink at least 3 months before to get the paperwork for the Pension. Make sure your child has a TAX file number (from the age of 5 years old).
